As an Emergency Medical Technician (EMT), you will provide Basic Life Support (BLS) care to people during their time of need.

Your help is needed in providing safe and effective emergency medical care to the ill or injured. Everyday will be different, you'll be part of a team, and you will develop camaraderie with fellow professionals. Most important you will be making a difference in your community.

According to the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics, job prospects for EMTs continues to be on the increase. By the year 2022, EMT employment will likely increase by 23%!

## EMERGENCY MEDICAL TECHNICIAN TRAINING PROGRAM

This training program is designed to prepare individuals with the skills and knowledge needed to perform in the field, as well as prepare them for the State of Connecticut and the National Registry Exam.

The program consists of 188 hours of training: 120 Lecture hours and 68 skills training hours. Students are also required to participate in clinical/field experience with an approved EMS service.

American Professional Educational Services Training Center is located at One American Way in Norwich, CT. We are one of the largest American Heart Association Training Center in New England. We have a spacious training facility with multiple classrooms equipped with state of the art audio-visual equipment.

The EMS programs at American Professional Educational Services are approved through the Connecticut State Department of Health, Office of Emergency Medical Services.

## Some of the tasks an EMT is expected to perform:

- Respond to 911 calls for emergency medical assistance, such as cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR) or bandaging a wound
- Assess a patient's condition and determine a course of treatment
- Follow guidelines learned in training or received from physicians who oversee their work
- Use backboards and restraints to keep patients still and safe in an ambulance during transport
- Help transfer patients to the emergency department of a healthcare facility and report their observations and treatment to the staff
- Create a patient care report, documenting the medical care given to the patient
- Replace used supplies and check or clean equipment after use
